

The "flipped" classroom

This is the idea that teachers shoot videos of their lessons, then make them available online for students to view at home. Class time is then devoted to problem solving – with the teacher acting as a guide to teams of students. It's a great approach that flips the delivery of the lesson to homework -it's like a TiVo time shift that can reshape your classroom.

How will we flip?

- Usually one 10 minute video lesson per week
- Students take notes like they would in class on the material
- Answer 2-4 questions (usually multiple choice) about the material

How can you watch the videos?

- At home on your computer or on your mobile device
- During school in study hall or before or after school

What if I don't have internet access to watch at home?

- Watch at school
- Bring in a flash drive to download video to watch at home
- Notify us ASAP so we can burn DVD's of the videos for you to watch at home

What if I don't watch the videos before they are due?

- You will watch the video in class while everyone else is doing an activity
- You will have to make up any work missed during Teacher Detention
